GENERAL STOREKEEPER OF

C. P. R. DEAD IN MONTREAL
M. J. Power, 114 Fourteen Weeks, Had
Been Operated on Four Times

M. J. Power, general storekeeper of the
C. P. R., died on Friday, in the Royal
Victoria Hospital, Montreal, after an ill-
ness of fourteen weeks. Mr. Power had
been confined to the Royal Victoria Hos-
pital for twelve weeks, and in that time
had undergone four operations. For some
time little hope had been held out for
his recovery.

Mr. Power, who was in his thirty-fifth
year, had been in the employ of the C.
P. R. since boyhood, having entered the
office of the general passenger agent
when fourteen years old. From there he
was transferred to the president's office
and up until last September held the
office of private secretary to Sir Thomas
Shaughnessy. Last September he received
the appointment of general store-
keeper.

Mr. Power was unmarried and resided
with his parents in Montreal. Besides his
mother and father, he is survived by
three sisters. His father is Patrick
