## DROPS TITLE; IS MR. F. C. BURG

Brother of Emperor - Breaks From Royalty for Love Of Girl

**MEET AT BALL**

Emperor of Austria Has Settled \$8,000 a Year Upon Them—Not the Only One of His Family to Map Out His Own Career

(Times Special Correspondence.)

Vienna, Oct. 26.—When it was announced some time ago that the brother of Austria's future emperor was going to throw away his title for love of a girl with no title, it was understood that the romantic pair were waiting for the consent of Uncle Franz Joseph, the present emperor, who had indignantly refused when he first heard the plan. But it can be stated without danger of contradiction that they are already married, and that the emperor's belated benediction was a diplomatic swallowing of a fact that couldn't be altered.

The archduke has decided to call himself Ferdinand Charles Burg, and he and his wife will live quietly in Switzerland.

Ferdinand Karl, who is forty-three years old, made the acquaintance of Fraulein Ginter, a professor's daughter, who is 38 years of age, at a ball in Prague, where he was stationed on military duty. He fell in love with her at once and desired to renounce his royal rank there and then, but he was dissuaded by the old emperor and his brother. His love for the professor's pretty daughter remained unchanged, however, and he lost all interest in his duties. He resigned from the army and retired to his Tyrolean castle. A few months ago he re-opened the subject with the emperor and gained his consent, which was given at last with good will and was accompanied by a settlement of the pair of \$8,000 a year.

Members of the Hapsburg house always have been noted for their unconventionality in matrimonial affairs. The old emperor himself has lived for years on affectionate terms with a woman who once was a famous actress. His only son, Archduke Rudolph, shot himself over a love affair and his widow, now Countess Louisa, contracted a marriage with a Hungarian count.

The story of Archduke Johann Salvator, who married Minnie Stueler, an actress, renounced his rank, and sailed away in a trading ship which he bought, never to be heard of again, is known to all the world. The recent heir to the throne, Franz Ferdinand, is married morganatically and his children are out of the line of succession to the throne.

In the Tuscan branch of the family there is the case of the ex-Crown Prince of Saxony who ran away from his husband and married Signor Teselli, a musician, and whose memoirs have just been published. Her brother, Archduke Leopold, renounced his rights to marry an actress and assumed the name of Leopold Walling.

### WAS FORMERLY OF THE ST. MARTINS SEMINARY

Rev. Dr. DeBlois Guest at Reception of Boston Church—He is New Pastor

Boston, Nov. 9.—A reception, attended by 350 persons was given last night at the Church Hall in Commonwealth avenue to the congregation of the First Baptist church to their new pastor, Dr. Austin K. Blois, and to Mrs. de Blois. Dr. de Blois succeeded Dr. Francis H. Rowley at June on the appointment of the latter to be head of the S. P. C. A. in Boston. He was born in Wolfville (N. S.), and graduated from Acadia College in 1886. After a brilliant career at Brown University, where he took the degree of M. A. and Ph. D., he entered the Baptist ministry and was for five years president of Shurtleff College, Alton (Ill.). In 1902 he accepted a call to the First Baptist church, Chicago, in the room of Dr. Loring. He is an able speaker, and his pastorate was marked by an increase of the church's strength and influence in every direction. Dr. de Blois is a great traveler. Before accepting he traversed all through Europe and in 1907 made an all-round the world tour of Christian missions in connection with the Laymen's Missionary Movement during which he visited China, India, Japan and Korea.

Dr. de Blois' call to the church on Commonwealth avenue comes as the result of two sermons, one of which was preached early in the year while on his way from the graveside of his mother, with whom he had just spent a vacation, and to whom a despatched a telegram had called him almost immediately after his return to Chicago. The sermons created a profound impression, and at a church meeting held soon after, it was unanimously decided to call him to the charge which had remained vacant nearly a year since Dr. Rowley's resignation.

At the reception held last night four ministers who have filled the pulpit at the First Baptist church, Drs. Cephas H. Crane, Francis H. Rowley, C. H. Mason of Springfield, and Nathan E. Wood, of Arlington, delivered addresses of welcome to the new pastor. Selections were given during the evening by the church choir. B. Atwood Robinson acted as master of ceremonies.

Dr. de Blois was once principal of St. Martin's Seminary.
