P. Liner Also Brings

to Sand Point

More Than 100 Children Among

The Canadian Pacific liner Montclair, Captain J. Turnbull, arrived at Sand Point from Liverpool at 10 o'clock Saturday night and came to anchor until yesterday morning about 9 o'clock, when she came up the harbor and docked at Nos. 2 and 3 berths, Sand Point. The ship brought 7,000 lbs of mail, which was landed at 10 o'clock, but the 135 cabin and 401 third class passengers did not disembark until 9 o'clock yesterday morning. After disembarking by customs and immigration officers most of them left for westward on a special C. P. R. train, one train leaving at noon and a second at 1:30 o'clock. The ship will haul across to No. 6 berth today, where she will discharge about 2,000 lbs of general cargo.

The large mail was mostly Christmas cards, letters and boxes. They were William Gordon, aged 13, who is destined to Montreal; Richard Eulon, aged 15, destined for Winnipeg; Minnie, Elone and Ivan Toka, 16, and 14, who were destined for Elmira, Sask.; Anna Djalun, 14, destined for Nicholsonville, and Marywick, aged 17, destined for Wexford, Vancouver Island.

There were 101 children and four infants aboard. As soon as the smaller children landed from the steamer they were taken to the nursery, where Miss Elaine, nurse in charge, assisted by staff, saw to it that they and their mothers were given refreshments and before proceeding on their journey.

The ordination sermon was by Rev. Canon Smithers. The candidates were: Rev. H. F. Best, of Oromocto; Rev. E. J. Fuller, curate of St. Luke's, Saint John; Rev. B. J. Davis, of Pinder, and Rev. F. M. Sherlock, curate of Christ Church Cathedral, Fredericton.

Rev. Mr. Sherlock is to leave Fredericton shortly to take a rectory in New Jersey.

Rev. Mr. Best is the son of Rev. W. E. Best, of Waterford, who is leaving Pinder since he came from England to return to England. Rev. H. F. Best was both a pupil and a master of the Rothery Collegiate School and is a graduate of King's College, and served overseas during the war.
