MINUTES OF THE TWENTY-FIFTH SYNOD

OF THE

MARITIME PROVINCES,

Presbyterian Church in Canada,

Halifax. N. S. Oct. 4-7, 1898

FIRST SEDERUNT.

*At Halifax, and within St. Matthew's Church there, Tuesday, the fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and at half-past seven o'clock in the evening :*

Which time and place the Synod of the Maritime Provinces of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met as appointed, and after Public Worship, conducted by the ex-Moderator, the Reverend A. Falconer, and the Moderator, the Reverend Joseph Henry Chase, M. A., who preached a sermon from the twelfth verse of the sixteenth chapter of the Gospel according to St. John,—“ I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now,” was constituted by him with prayer.
