The Review Horticult. is authority for the following list of plants which are repulsive to certain injurious insects and animals.

It has been shown by repeated experiments that the nasturtium, Tropaeolum, planted about the trunks of apple trees infested with the woolly aphid, Schizura lanigera, (Hausma), will eventually rid the trees of the pest.

The roots of the black henbane, Hyoscyamus niger, placed in granaries, will do away with mice.

The castor oil plant, Ricinus communis, has been successfully used to protect the grapevine from injury by moles.

The leaves of the chamomile, Anthemis, rubbed upon the skin of horses, protects them from annoyance by flies.

In addition to these it may be mentioned that a decoction of the leaves of the common burdock, Lappa officinalis, appears to have considerable value for protecting the roots of cabbages and onions from injury by maggots, Anthomyia, and of the strawberry plant from damage by the white grub, Lachnosterna fusca.
