**THOUSANDS ARE  
WITHOUT FUEL  
IN CHICAGO**

Most Acute Fuel Shortage of  
Winter and Situation Ser-  
ious—Ten Degrees Below  
Zero and Railroads Tied up.

Chicago, Feb. 4.—The most acute  
fuel shortage of the winter to date  
of the colder days combined to bring  
what officials declared was a really  
serious situation to Chicago today.  
With the thermometers registering 10  
degrees below zero, railroads found  
the task of switching cars difficult,  
if not impossible. As a consequence,

into a period of scarcity at the fuel  
yards.
