NEW GOV'T WILL TAKE CHARGE ON NOVEMBER 14TH

NEW GOVERNMENT ARMY LEADER
Toronto, Nov. 5.—Friday, the 14th day of November, will usher in Ontario's first United-Farmer-Coalition Government. Barring happenings that are at present unforeseen, Ernest Charles Drury, U.F.O. leader, will on that day take over the reins of Government with the assistance of such Cabinet Ministers as shall in the meantime have been selected to assist him.
During the course of a 25-minute interview with Sir John Hendrie, Lieutenant-Governor, this morning, the King's representative in this Province made the formal request of the United-Farmer leader to assume the responsibility of framing a Government. Mr. Drury replied by assuring Sir John that he would do so, but asked for time for the assembly of his Cabinet. On the 14th, he assured the Governor, he would be in a position to step into the Premiership and fill the various portfolios.
At Mr. Drury's request Premier Sir William Hearst will carry on the affairs of the Province until such time as the U. F. O. Labor leader is in a position to handle the affairs of State. Sir William has agreed to do this.

NEARLY ALL RESTRICTIONS REMOVED.
A Few Commodities Must Have License.
Canada has removed nearly all import and export restrictions which owed their origin to enemy trading regulations. During the war it was necessary to prohibit all trading with the enemy directly or indirectly. On the cessation of peace with Germany the necessity for this prohibition ceased. Exports are untrammelled now so far as war restrictions are concerned, except certain war material to a few European countries and a wide range of commodities to Russia. Export licenses are free granted for shipments to Asiatic Russia and those parts of European Russia not under Bolshevik control. There are, of course, a few commodities which and wheat products, sugar, hides and leather, narcotics, gold and Russian rouble notes the export of which to all countries can be made only under license. There are no import restrictions based on war conditions, except in regard to Russian rouble notes. A few commodities including wheat and wheat products, sugars, narcotics, liquors, oleomargarine, are controlled imports from all countries.

A NEW USE FOR THE AEROPLANE.
To Locate Swampy Areas of Mosquitoes.
The Department of Agriculture at Ottawa has discovered a new use for the aeroplane. The Entomological Branch is investigating the mosquito and other breeding places that are readily located by photographs taken from over head, according to a statement by Dr. C. G. Hewitt, Dominion Entomologist, that appears in the October Agricultural Gazette. The aeroplane was used in making a comprehensive survey of the complicated water system of the Fraser River and the adjacent bodies of permanent and temporary water in that district. A flight reported by Dr. Hewitt has demonstrated the possibility of using this machine also for making surveys of timber that is being killed or has already been destroyed by various insects. Its use, it is believed will help very greatly to the entomological work with various insects being carried on by the Federal Department of Agriculture.

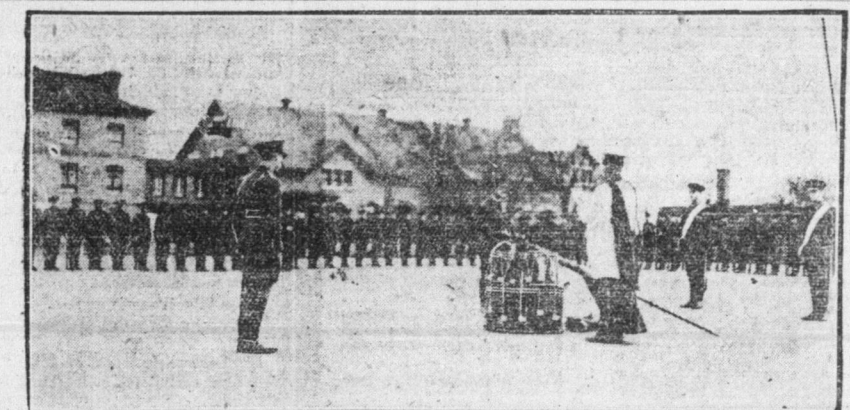
