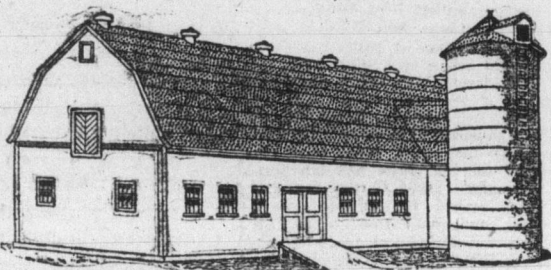

## OSLER'S OWN WORDS

### WHEN TO CHLOROFORM

Much-Distorted Utterance on Comparative Uselessness of Men Over 40—Age of Achievement

In a speech at the anniversary exercises of Johns Hopkins University on February 23, 1906, Dr. William Osler, later Sir William Osler, said, as widely reported the next day: "I have two fixed ideas well known to my friends. The first is the comparative uselessness of men above 40 years of age. This may seem shocking, and yet read aright the world's history bears out the statement. Take the sum of human achievement in action, in science, in art, in literature; subtract the work of the men above 40; and, while we should miss great treasures—even priceless treasures—we would practically be where we are to-day."

Vitalizing Work Before 40  
"It is difficult to name a great and far-reaching conquest of the mind which has not been given to the world by a man on whose back the sun was still shining. The effective, moving, vitalizing work of the world is done between the ages of 25 and 40, those fifteen golden years of plenty, the anabolic or constructive period, in which there is always a balance in the mental bank and the credit is still good. My second fixed idea is the uselessness of men above 60 years of age and the incalculable benefit it would be in commercial, political and professional life if, as a matter of course, men stopped work at this age. Donne tells us in his 'Devotional' that by the laws of certain wise States sexagenarii were precipitated from a bridge, and in Rome men of that age were not admitted to the suffrage, and they were called deponenti because the way to the Senate was per pontem (over the bridge) and they, from age, were not permitted to come hither."

Chloroform for Men of 60  
"In that charming novel 'The Fixed Period' Anthony Trollope discusses the practical advantages in modern life of a return to this ancient usage, and the plot hinges on the admirable scheme of a college into which at 60 men retired for a year of contemplation before a peaceful departure by chloroform." This utterance was widely distorted and the impression got about that Dr. Osler had said that no men over 40 had done anything of consequence and that men of 60 should be chloroformed.

### SUB-ARCTICS MODERN

Tukon and Alaska lands of scenic marvels are not the remote frontier without any of the comforts of civilization that have been so often pictured, says Walter W. Liegett. Alaskan and Yukon cities are small, but they possess every comfort of life, including plumbing, electric lights, telephones, well kept city water supplies, fire departments, etc. Grand Trunk Pacific's transcontinental line striking into the Pacific Coast at Prince Rupert, forty miles below the Alaskan boundary line, has up all this great Northland to Canadian traffic and provided a new short route and fast steamship service to import and export Alaskan ports.

### SERENITY OF FALCONER

University President and Classical Scholar, but Very Modern

"If I were asked what most impressed me in Sir Robert Falconer," said one who knew well the knight who presided over the fortunes of Toronto University, "I should say that it was his serenity. He is, I think, the most serene man I have ever met. His manner is serene, so is his mind. And both mind and manner are serious as well as serene." In office his distinctive policy was to trust the undergraduates to discipline themselves. Herein he was not only successful. It was his great achievement to bring peace—"peace with honor"—to the storm-tossed soul of Toronto University. His sense of public duty is remarkable. This is particularly exemplified in his public speaking. He gives every audience the best that is in him. No matter "talks down" to nor does he talk over the heads of his hearers. And when he is in the atmosphere inevitably takes on something of thoughtfulness. The president is a fine classical scholar. But he bears no outward impress of Rome or Athens. He is emphatically a twentieth century Canadian, and, as such, even classical learning seems to take on a greater practicality than it does in some other cases. But far beyond his classical attainments must be placed his capability of discharging so many and such various duties with never-failing dignity and acceptance.

### AGRICULTURE IS VITAL

Support to Other Great Industries—Cropping vs. Mining

Agriculture must not only be self-supporting, but, in large degree, agriculture must support our other great industries. Without agriculture, the coal and iron would be left in the earth, the forests would be left uncut, the railroads would be abandoned, the cities depopulated, and the wooded land and waterways would again be used only for hunting and fishing. Shall we not remember, for example, that the coal mine yields a single harvest—one crop—and is then forever abandoned; while the soil must yield a hundred—yes, a thousand crops, and even then it must be richer and more productive than at the beginning. If those who come after us are to continue to multiply and replenish the earth.
