Of Irish and French Canadian parentage. B. in the City of Quebec, 1829. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary. M., 16 Aug. 1858, Marie Zoe Virginie, eldest dau. of M. Ambroise Verret, of Quebec. A member of the firm of McCall, Shehyn & Co., wholesale dry goods merchants. Is a Dir. of the Stadacona Bank; President of the Quebec Board of Trade; and a member of the Quebec Harbour Commission. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at g.e. 1875, reelected at g.e. 1878, and again at last g.e., by acclamation. A Libsral.—Grand Allée, Quebec.

SPENCER, EDMUND E. (Mississquoi.)

First returned to Parlt. for present seat at last g.e. A Conservative.—St. Armand, East, P.Q.

STEPHENS, G. W. (Montreal Centre.)

Is an Alderman of the City of Montreal, and has taken a prominent part in municipal affairs. First returned for present seat at last g.e. A Liberal.—Montreal.

St. HILAIRE, E. (Chicoutimi and Saguenay)

First returned to Parliament for present seal at last g.e., on a recount of the ballots, his opponent, Mr. P. H. Dumais, having at first been declared elected. An Independent.

ST. MAURICE, FAUCHER DE. (Bellechasse.)

First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative, and a supporter of Mr. Chapleau.—Quebec.

Taillon, Louis Olivier. (Montreal East.)

B. at Terrebonne, P.Q., 26 Sept. 1840. Ed. at Masson College. M., July 1875, Marie Louise Georgina, dau. of the late Hon. P. U. Archambault, for several years a M.L.C. of Canada (she d. 24 Jan. 1876.) Called to the Bar, L.C., 1865. Was one of the originators of the great French Canadian national demonstration which took place in Montreal on the festival of St. Jean Baptiste, 1874. First returned
