Another slow first half start wasn't enough to prevent the UNB Varsity Reds men's basketball team from an opportunity to win 4 points, but in the end the Reds came up one basket shy of stunning the Dalhousie Tigers Saturday night at "The Pit."

In the first half, the Reds seemed frustrated with Dal's speed and aggressive defence. After missing their first two open field goal shots the Reds did settle down with Gordon McNeilly contributing six of their first eight points. McNeilly holds down third spot in scoring leaders for points per game with 18.1. He also leads the team with 6.4 rebounds per game.

The game stayed close until mid-way through the first half when Dalhousie opened up a substantial lead with precision passing and shooting and their big man, Shawn Plancke, blocked several UNB shots. For an 8 minute stretch the Reds were held to just one pointcoming from the foul line. The half ended with Dal holding a 36-22 lead and very much in control of the game.


