Extract of a Letter from George Amoside Esq,
 Superintendent of Indian Affairs at the
 Post of Amherstburg dated 28th June 1820
 and addressed to the Honorable Simon
 Blane Deputy Superintendent General of
 Indian Affairs & Fort George

" Altho' I thought I knew the Prophecy Character
 " to the bottom he has yet exceeded in impudence
 " and falsehood in his speech anything I thought
 " him Capable of, but he has had an antipathy
 " against me and my Family since we were
 " at the Head of the Lake for an abuse of power
 " for Covardice during the war, The late
 " Colonel Elliott had a great share of patience
 " and yet he had nearly knocked him down
 " in Council for his impudence and lies at Mr.
 " Brants I have however the satisfaction
 " that my Conscience clears me of all his
 " accusations.

Nothing could prevail on him
 " or the Hurons to name the writer,
 " The Hurons have now got a band of
 " Chippewas from Point Pelee / Caldwell's
 " party / settled within reserve I suppose
 " to assist them in a refusal of the purchase
 " should it be proposed by the Government
