Dear Sir:

I regret to see by the daily Press that Senator Little saw fit to interrogate you as to the O.S.P. bonds held by you.

If it should become necessary for you to deal him a knockout blow I am enclosing you the necessary documents for such a purpose. His Solicitors, Messrs. Green & Johnston, of Ottawa gave consent to judgment but Senator Little has been fighting to keep this judgment from being entered because he would necessarily have to resign as Senator, and is setting up a claim that the plaintiffs had agreed not to enter it. The Court has ordered it to be tried next month.

It might be well for you to know that the monies represented by the consent to judgment were stolen by him from Robinson, Little & Company. He with three other brothers took, according to the auditor's report, \$ 473,483.97 while they were directors, without resolution of the directors or knowledge of the shareholders, and not even for services rendered. After the action was brought they gave promissory notes to the Company and had the Company without consulting any directors transfer the notes to the Bank of Montreal as collateral security to the Company's indebtedness to the Bank.
