

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE. After a period of convalescence I was allowed to return to half duty ,and was appointed to the Inspection Services , Militia Headquarters, as Assistant to the Chief Inspector C.E.F. and Inspector of Military District No. 3.

My Duties here were various as I had under my supervision Offices located at different Camps, each with its own complement of Officers and Men for the purpose of making a continuous Audit of all C.E.F. accounts and an examination of all records, giving Paymasters a course in the Administration of their Dept. as well as My-self giving personal Instruction to Commanding Officers and Adjutants on Administration of C.E.F. Units (all Branches of Service) in all its parts, conduct Courts of Inquiry, report on the Administration of Training Camps (on the request of the then Minister of Militia, I made the Report recommending that Petawawa Camp be established as it is today as a separate camp, my recommendations as to this and its Administration were adopted . The report is on File at Headquarters) I also Inspected Patrols along International Boundary (it was my report that changed the St. Lawrence Canal Patrol from a Military to a Plain Clothes Organization) The above was clearly Administrative and as you know governed by K . R . & O., Military Law, Administration C . E . F . Units, Etc. It had a bread scope. However my Chief at that time will vouch for the success of my Administration.
