I am in receipt of your letter of the lith instant, with which you submitted a report for the month of April from Micr L. L. Claveland regarding her work as field matron at Gwinoha on the Same River for the nonth of April; and in reply I beg to say that it is observed that she states that the school whildren appear at school with their hair much tidler than in the past. It is pleasing to know of this improvement and it is hoped that she will be able to train them in habite of cleanliness and teach them to be tidy in their habits.

In Department has also received your letter of the lith May, and Miss Rayd's report of field matron work at Alyaneh and Gitlakdamiks for the month of April. It is observed that you state that it was not necessary for her to go to Pishery Day owing to the fact that Miss Gapper and Miss Sturges necessaried the Indians to that place. The field matron should upon every opportunity endeavour to impress upon the Indian methers the necessity of giving proper care to their infants. The should teach them that it is necessary to pay attention to the children's eyes when the same are sore, in order to prevent development of diseases of the eyes.

It is hoped that the Indians will thurseastly cleanse their premises and new gardens in order that they may have vegetables and flowers later on in the season.
