Re:- Indian Trapground proposed alterations. Pat Mc Cluskey Fmly.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated Doc. 4. th in which some some alterations to the above existing indian trapground is all cut and dried for acceptance by this Office.

As the Indian concerned has not mentioned the matter here, the papers will not be signed, but are retained and will be sent below for consideration.

The above indian Pat Mc Cluskey has just signed off from the Joe Colburn Band of Indians, and he will have to accept such ground as may-be outside the Joe Colburn area.

Such a movement as suggested by your Department will caused much hard tribal feeling, especially as the Mc Cluskey ground has now some area belonging to the Ness family -1.e. Willow Creek.

May a map be allowed of the above re-arrangement, as according to the laid down routine when applications are newly made. It is mentioned also that the papers submitted have not been passed by your head Office, and a line cannot be altered unless cancelled - as you well know.
