the preceding paragraph. At no time in his career subsequent to 1825 did Hugo shrink from offending the academic sense of dignity, but now familiarity of expression is more frequently encountered, a familiarity which is sometimes playfully grotesque, at other times willfully trivial. In this third period we must note also that Hugo's ideas have become more radical in religion and in politics. While remaining a theist, he is intensely anti-Catholic, and the royalism of his youth is supplanted by a democratic sentiment little short of revolutionary. His mysticism is also more pronounced. Examples of his familiarity of expression may be observed in "Le cimetière d'Eylau." For a note on his mysticism see the in roductory remarks to the Visionary Poems (pp. 179-180).
