Regulations for Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates.

No degree or other testimonial will be conferred on any student unless the prescribed course of study—whether pursued here or m any other chartered college—shall have been completed here, and satisfactory evidence of proficiency in the various subjects shall have been given.

Students from chartered colleges bearing certificates of having satisfactorily followed the course of studies in said institutions, will be admitted to the corresponding class in the college, without further examination.

A certificate of proficiency may be given to a student who has followed, under the direction of the Faculty, a special course of one or more subjects, and who has shown his proficiency therein.

The Degree of "Bachelor of Arts" is conferred on students who successfully undergo, at the end of their course, the examination of Grade xii for the English part, and who, for their classical course, have had an average of 50 in their semi-annual examinations.

The Degree of Master in Arts is conferred on those who, having obtained the Degree of Bachelor in Arts, have subsequently devoted at least five years—with marked success—to further li erary or professional study.

The Degree of Bachelor in Science is conferred on students who finish successfully the Scientific Course.

The Degree of Master in Science is conferred on those who, having obtained the Degree of Bachelor of Science, have subsequently devoted at least five years—with acknowledged merit—to further scientific pursuits.

At the discretion of the Faculty, the same or other honorary distinctions may be conferred on men of high position and merit, when their successful career in some Art or Science has entitled them to public recognition.

For every Degree a fee of Eight Dollars is charged.

A Diploma is granted to those who finish the Business Course, as a guarantee of fitness to engage in mercantile pursuits.

For every Diploma a fee of Five Dollars is charged.
