A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clausses (2) (8) or (4) must cultivate 80 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of slock, with buildings for their ac-commodation, and have bealdes 80 acres substantially fenced. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again throw open for entry.

#### APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

### REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 3 and 26, which has not been home-seaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other pur-poses, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quatter section of 180 acres, more or less. or less.
