WANT LEGISLATION TO REDUCE FIRE LOSS

Petition to Quebec Government will Follow Report to National Fire Protection Association

REDUCE INSURANCE. Issue Policies for Only 80 Per Cent. of Value Insured—No More Insurance after Number of Fires.

Insurance companies should be compelled to file annual reports showing their income, their losses, and their expenditures within the limits of the city of Montreal.

Wider powers should be given to the Fire Commissioners so that they could fine anyone having caused fire through negligence or non-compliance with the fire prevention by-laws.

MORALLY CERTAIN OF GUILT JUDGE HAS TO FREE PRISONER

Insufficient Evidence Says Judge Bazin in Liberating Carrier, Charged With Arson—Gosselin Guilty of Starting Fire.

In the Court of Special Sessions yesterday, Adelard Carrier, arrested in connection with the fire at the Christian Brothers School, was acquitted. Judge Bazin, who was on the bench, said, however, that while he was forced to discharge the prisoner because of insufficient proof, he was morally certain of the man's guilt.

The outbreaks occurred only a few days following the fire that destroyed the Academy of the Holy Name of Mary and Lasalle College, involving a loss of \$250,000. The home of the Christian Brothers, where Carrier was employed as cook, was saved by the firemen when the two schools adjoining were destroyed.

A few days later there were other outbreaks and as a result of the subsequent investigation Carrier was committed for trial.

Edmond Gosselin was found guilty of attempting to burn the house in which he resided at 222 Boyer street, by setting fire to a mattress. He gave three or four different versions of the cause of the outbreak to the firemen, telling one of them that he set fire to the mattress in order to burn the house because he objected to his wife leaving their piano to a relative. Gosselin was remanded until Tuesday, when he will receive his sentence.
