BILL for establishing Ferries between the city of Quebec and the Parish of St. Joseph, commonly called the Parish of Point Levi, was, according to order, read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Blackwood, seconded by Mr. Durocher;

RESOLVED, that the faid Bill be referred to a Committee of seven Members, with power to send for persons and papers, and to report thereon, with all convenient speed.

ORDERED, that Mr. Blackwood, Mr. Bell, Mr. Bedard, Mr. Borgia, Mr. Taschereau, Mr. Lee, and Mr. Ross Cuthbert, do compose the faid Committee.

Mr. Gugy from the Committee of the whole House, to whom it was referred, to consider whether the House shall, in this Session, vote the necessary sums for paying all the expences of the Civil Administration of the Government of this Province, reported, according to order, the resolutions, which the Committee had directed him to submit to the House; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's table, where the resolutions were read, and are as followeth, videlicet:

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that this Province is, at present, able to pay all the Civil Expences of its Government.

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that the House of Assembly ought to vote, during this Session, the necessary sums for defraying the Civil Expences of the Government of this Province.

On motion of Mr. Bedard, seconded by Mr. Borgia;

ORDERED, that the question of concurrence be now separately put on the said resolutions.
