On motion of Mr. Weldon.—Whereas it has been stated to this House, that William Cross did use threatening and abusive language towards a Member of this House touching his vote on a question before this House, and that the said William Cross did assault the said Member,

Thereupon ordered that the Sergeant at Arms do forthwith take the said William Cross in custody and bring him to the Bar of the House, to answer to such things as may be objected against him.

Mr. Speaker informed the House that the Sergeant at Arms had William Cross in custody in obedience to the order of the House.

The said William Cross was thereupon brought to the Bar, and made acquainted with the charges preferred against him.

Ordered that the said William Cross do withdraw, and that the Sergeant at Arms do detain him in custody, to await such order as the House may make.

Resolved unanimously, that the Speaker do issue his Warrant for the commitment of William Cross to the Common Gaol of the County of York, there to remain during the pleasure of the House.

A Message from His Majesty’s Council.

Mr. Putnam, Master in Chancery, acquainted the House that the Council had passed a Bill to secure and reclaim a tract of Marsh on the Au Lac River in the County of Westmorland, to which they request the concurrence of the House.

And that he was directed to inform the House that the Council had agreed to the Address prepared by the Joint Committee of the Council and Assembly, on the subject of Aliens, and have appointed Mr. Hurd a Committee with such Committee as the House shall appoint, to wait upon His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and request that he will be pleased to transmit the same to be laid before His Majesty.
