shall be found running at large between the faid first day of September and the twentieth day of December, in this present or any subsequent year, may belong. Be it therefore enacted by the authority aforefaid, That it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons finding such ram or rains at large during the aforesaid time, contrary to the providing of this A&, to impound fuch rain or rains in the common pound. or confine such ram or rains in some building within the township, where such ram or rams shall be so found, and to affix notice in writing, under the signature of such perfon or perform to impounding or confining such ram or rams, on the outlide of such pound or building, and also in some other conspicuous place in the said township, (which notice shall be dated on the day on which the same shall be so affixed) of such ram organs having been found at large contrary to law, and being impounded or confined, either in the common pound or fome other building to be described in such notice (as the case may be) and such person or persons that immediately proceed to bring to conviction such owner or owners; and if the owner or owners of such ram or rams, thall not within feven days after fuch notice thalf be fo given, pay the faid fum of twenty hillings, together with the pound-keepers fees, and the colls and charges attending the support and feeding such ram or rams during his or their confinement, (luch costs and charges to be afcertained and adjudged by the Magistrate before whom any conviction shall take place by virtue of this Act) it shall and may be lawful to and for the perfor, or perfors who shall so have impounded or confined such ram or. rams, and who in Il have convicted the owner or owners of such ram or rams, of have ing offended against this Act, to expose such ram or rams to sale, and out of the money ariling from such sale, to pay such sum of twenty shillings, together with such colts and charges as aforefaid, in cale the proceeds of fuch fales fliall be found fufficient to pay the same, and if more than sufficient, to return the overplus to the owner or owners of fuch ram or rams, and if fuch proceeds shall be found infusscient for the purpoles aforefaid, then, and in fuch cale, fuch proceeds shall, in the first place, be applied in payment of the pound-keeper's fees and the coffs and charges attending the supporting and seeding such ram or rams, and the remainder to be applied in manner following, viz. one half of such remainder to the informer, and the other half to his Majefly's Receiver General, for the public ules of this Province.

Forfeitures and penalties to be accounted for.

V. And be it further Enatted, That no profecution shall be carried on under the anthority of this Act, unless the same shall be commenced within eight days after any ram or rams shall be found running at large, contrary to the provisions herein contained, nor shall any distress be levied under the authority of this Act, in any case where any ram or rams to impounded or contined as aforesaid, shall have been sold under the provisions herein contained, but the proceeds of such sale or sales only, shall at all times be deemed and considered as liable to satisfy the penalty and all costs by this Act intended to be imposed.

VI. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all such parts of the forfeitures and penalties as are by this Act directed to be paid to his Majesty's Receiver
General, to and for the public uses of this Province, shall be accounted for to his Majesty, his beirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's
Treasury, in such manner and form as his Majesty, his heirs or successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.

CHAP. V

An ACT to promulgate the Provincial Statutes, and also to repeal so much of an All passed in the forty-kerst year of the neign of his present Majely, as relates to Printing the Journals.

BE it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Ast passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to re-
