London, May 18—In the course of a debate in the House of Commons yesterday on aerial service, Harold J. Tennant, Parliamentary Under Secretary for War, said Great Britain had two types of aeroplane faster than any ossessed by Germany and two other types as fast as the Fokker. It was far from true to say Germany had the supremacy of the the air, he continued. On the contrary, England had a very large measure of supremacy, and in a great majority of combats here airmen were the win-

Mr. Tennant said arrangements for giving warning of Zeppelin raids were now complete, and that there has been a great improvement in rehas been a great improvement in regard to lights and guns.

Mr. Tennant announced the Government had decided to constitute an aerial board to advise the Admiralty and the War Office in regard to air services and designs of machines. Earl Curzon had accepted, the presidency of the board, of which Lord Sydenham will be a member. Major Blair will represent the board in the House of Commons. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and sultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acree, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
