FARMERS KICK AGAINST TAX

Discussing the affect of some of the legislation of the last session Dr. Argue stated that in Grenfell district the secretary treasurers of the local improvement districts find the collection of the one cent an acre tax very inconvenient especially in cases where the regular notices were sent out before the government advised them about the supplementary revenue tax. ment districts have refused to administer the new law where it conflicts with their duties and necessitates a repetition of the work already done. Many have consulted counsel and are advised that in cases where the assessment notices were sent out before they received instructions respecting the cent an acre tax, they cannot be compelled to make out a new assessment and therefore this tax under these circumstances cannot be collected this year. The affect of this will be that the money which the government anticipated under the secondary education act will not be available for school purposes and the next financial statement presents to the legislature will thus show the weakness of the government's scheme of direct taxation. The Grenfell district, of course, is not alone in their opposition to this tax, for there is a general kick from all over the province. (Continued on page 6.)
