It is due to his energy and vision that the valley is now covered with smiling orchards and is one of the assets of the Dominion.

From his newspaper office in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, in 1894, Mr. Robinson observed a family of eight, with their savings of ten thousand dollars, leaving for California.

Two years later Mr. Robinson and his party went to Rossland, at the time of the mining-boom and formed a prospecting party who went into the Okanagan valley and located claims near Peachland and established Camp Hewitt.

This was one of the first small fruit farm enterprises in Canada where the irrigation system was installed by the company.

Having found Peachland, Mr. Robinson determined to exploit a new district and to the south of his last enterprise, purchased ten thousand acres in 1903.
