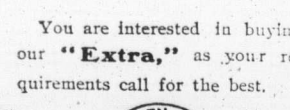

## ANOTHER GREAT FIRE.

The Business Part of Fernie, British Columbia, Wiped Out of Existence.

The Loss Will Amount to at Least Half a Million Dollars—The Insurance.

FEW RESIDENCES WERE DESTROYED.

FERNIE, B. C., April 29.—Nine-tenths of the business part of Fernie is in ashes.

Fire broke out in C. Richards general store at 3:30 and four hours later it is still burning but its bounds are now defined. Richards' store is near the southern end of the business part.

The fire quietly spread north and south along Victoria avenue.

A special effort was made to save the town at the coal company's offices, but the water supply almost failed entirely and the crowd could do nothing but stand around and watch the flames jump across the street to the next block, where the biggest half of business houses are located.

On the south end the fire was heroically fought and stopped at the Central Hotel at the first corner.

The fire on the north end, however, swept Victoria Avenue on both sides, down as far as the Northern Hotel, where the chemical engine and the little water supply saved it from further spreading.

The fire also spread to Baker street, where two hotels and two wholesale liquor stores are located and levelled them all, endangering the C. P. R. freight shed.

Building will commence at once.

The citizens are doing everything possible to assist those without homes.

Very few residences were burned. Among the business houses saved were the Free Press, the Northern Central and Roma hotels, Shepherd Elliott, Herdward Roberts, furniture.

Six hotels and Christ Church were burned.

Nearly the whole of six blocks were burned in street.

No correct estimate can yet be formed as to the extent of the damage. The fire burned slowly owing to no wind and a rain storm, which kept everything damp. Much property was saved and piled in immense heaps on the common.

The damage may reach half a million dollars. The insurance companies are well loaded here and their losses will be heavy.

Business men have already expressed the opinion that the fire will result in ultimate good, as the town will now be built up with substantial buildings instead of the fire traps such as lined the main street, this morning before the fire.

"Billy" Ganong, formerly of this city, has been running an hotel at Fernie, but it is not known whether or not it was among those destroyed.]

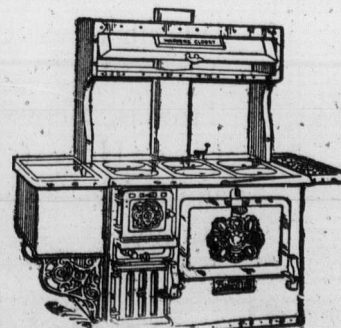
