Even Hundred in a Mad Fight for Life.

BROOKER'S DRAMATIC DEATH

Jumped from Bridge 120 Feet High

—Children Given Poisoned Lemons by an Unknown—Bloody Family Tragedy in Indian Territory.

South Norwalk, Conn., June 30.—Even hundred employees of the John W. Green hat factory left Danbury yesterday for an excursion to Glen Falls, the steamer Mohawk being chartered for the trip. After spending the day on the island the party boarded the steamer for the return trip about 5 o'clock. The steamer had been under way about ten minutes when she struck a rock, and a panic followed, during which every one of the 700 passengers on board scrambled for life preservers. Men fought the women who had life preservers and bucked them about their necks. In the crush which followed the announcement that the steamer was sinking, women and children were knocked down and trampled upon. One child had an arm broken, another was picked up seriously injured about the body.

BROKE BUSH'S NOSE.

A Rough Attacked a Wine Clerk in the Horse Shoe Inn.

John Orr, Jun., a rough well-known to the Police Court officials, is under arrest for a charge of aggravated assault on Bert Bush, a wine clerk in Nicholson's Horse Shoe Inn.
