

BY-LAW

Authorizing a Loan of five thousand pounds for the erection of the necessary County Buildings, for the County of Perth.

WHEREAS it is necessary to borrow the sum of five thousand pounds for the erection of the necessary County Buildings for the County of Perth, as required by the 15th Sect. of the Act 12 Vic. Ch. 76.

And whereas the amount of ratable property in the said County of Perth, appears by the assessment returns for the year 1851, to be £474,358 4 11.

And whereas the sum of £741 3 8, will require to be raised annually for the payment of interest, and the redemption of the said Loan, and according to the terms of payment hereafter provided.

And whereas a special rate of three pence in the pound, on all ratable Real and Personal property in the County of Perth, according to the assessment returns for the year 1851, will be required for the payment of interest, and the formation of a sinking fund, for the redemption of said debt, or Loan.
