War News

Messages Received During the Night.

GERMAN ARMY MAKES NO PROGRESS.

Special Evening Telegram.

LONDON, Oct. 1. Although the expectations of a decisive battle are still regarded in the official German press as satisfactory, the German army which crossed the Meuse between Verdun and Toul seems to have made no progress, and the unbroken line of the Allies has disappeared in the belief that the Allies have strongly corked up the hole made at St. Mihiel. In the west progress is reported in the extension of the flank movement, though the sensational reports from Paris that the German right had been broken, and that Von Kluck was thinking of surrendering, evidently outran the facts.

GENERAL SITUATION SATISFACTORY.

PARIS, Oct. 1. The official announcement issued to-night says: This evening there is nothing of particular importance to describe except in the region of Roye on the French left wing, where a violent action has successfully turned in our favor, and in the Argonne where we have made progress at several new points. The general situation is satisfactory.

INDIAN TROOPS LANDED IN FRANCE.

LONDON, Oct. 1. The War Information Bureau made it known to-day that Indian troops were landed in France late Friday at a point not stated, but it is presumed the troops disembarked at Marseilles.

COLOGNE IN A PANIC.

LONDON, Oct. 1. The Copenhagen correspondent of the London News, wires that 60,000 wounded Germans have arrived at Cologne, and the great Exposition Building there has been transformed into a hospital, where the wounded are being cared for. Most of the wounded are victims of artillery duels that have been in progress for the last 17 days along the Aisne. In many instances the wounded are in a panic, fearing raids by British aeroplanes. The city is also suffering from spy fever, and as many as 21 suspects have been shot in one day.

A LARGE NUMBER OF GERMANS KILLED AND WOUNDED.

ANTWERP, Oct. 1. The Belgian troops in a series of successful sorties from the southern forts late to-day, captured a number of artillery and killed and wounded a large number of Germans. The Germans had been shelling the forts with a view to a bombardment in accordance with pre-arranged agreement, apparently ceased firing. The Germans

BATTLE OF CRACOV.

VIENNA, Oct. 1. The battle of Cracow began to-day when the advancing Russian army arrived at the outlying forts and were attacked by combined German and Austrian armies. Indications are that the battle will last long and be bitterly contested, as the Austro-German forces are strongly entrenched and well equipped.

GERMAN AMBASSADOR AND THE ROUMANIAN CABINET.

BERLIN, Oct. 1. The German Ambassador at Bucharest held a lengthy conference with the Roumanian Cabinet to-day. It is understood he very frankly warned the Roumanian Government that any declaration of war or hostile acts against Austria would of necessity involve Germany. It is also announced here that Turkey to-day expelled from Turkish territory all correspondents of Russian newspapers.

FOREIGN OFFICE DENIES REPORT.

LONDON, Oct. 1. The Foreign Office issued a statement to-night stating that the report published in London to-day saying that the situation between Turkey and Great Britain and the Allies was critical, was not authorized, and did not represent the views of the Government.

CONTRABAND OF WAR.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1. United States Ambassador Page, at London, to-day, cabled the State Department that the British Government intends to treat as conditional contraband of war the following: Copper, lead (pig, sheet or pipe), glycerine, hematite, iron ore, rubber, hides and skins, raw or rough tanned not dressed leather.

INVASION OF GERMANY SOUTH.

WEST AFRICA. LONDON, Oct. 1. The invasion of German Southwest Africa proceeds successfully.

GERMAN CRUISER SINKS BRITISH STEAMER.

LONDON, Oct. 1. The German cruiser Leipzig sunk the British steamer Banksfields off Peru. The crew were saved.

CREW LANDED.

CALLAO, Peru, Oct. 1. The Kosmos steamer Marie arrived here to-day, with the crew of the British steamer Banksfields sent by the German cruiser Leipzig, off Elen, Peru. The crew of the Banksfields have appealed to the British Consul here in the hope of obtaining their liberty. The men said their ship carried a cargo of sugar valued at five million, after a voyage of 40 days. The steamer was followed into port by the German Annullis, also of the Kosmos line.

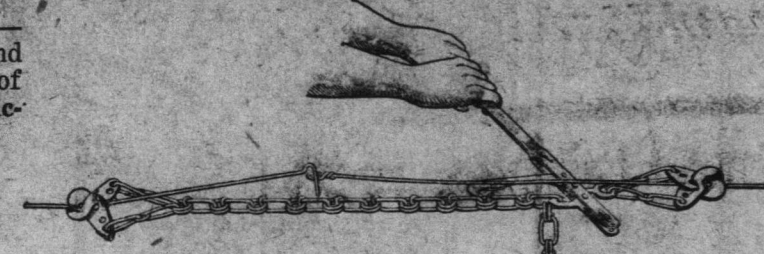
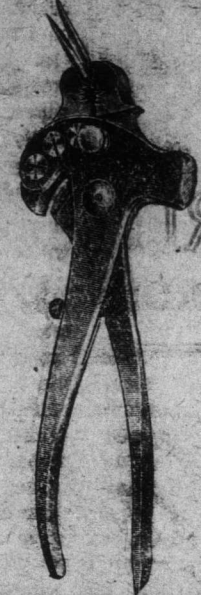
