## Wilhelm War Crazed Egomaniac.

German Emperor Puts Himself Even  
Before Duty, "Me Und Gott."

Washington, Sept. 15.—National  
leaders here look upon Kaiser Wil-  
helm as a dangerous and crafty  
egomaniac, who always thinks on  
himself first, Germany second and  
then of God as the protector of his  
plans.

In his ordinary messages the Kaiser  
always thinks of himself as the only  
person to be consulted. The people  
are an after-thought, and there is  
usually some reference to the Deity  
as favoring the Germans.

What the Messages Show.

An examination of some of the  
Kaiser's recent messages is illumina-  
ting. Just to take this year: Jan. 6,  
after his first peace bubble was punc-  
tured, he issued the following pro-  
clamation to the army and navy:

"Conjointly with the allied (central  
powers) rulers, I proposed to our  
enemies to enter forthwith into peace  
negotiations. Our enemies refused  
my offer. Their hunger for power  
desires Germany's destruction. The  
war will be continued. Before God  
and humanity, I declare that on the  
Governments of our enemies alone  
falls the heavy responsibility for all  
the further terrible sacrifice from  
which I wish to save you. Our ene-  
mies did not want the understanding  
offered by me. With God's help our  
arms will enforce it."

Jan. 27 appeared an account of his  
speech in reply to the Austrian Em-  
peror's congratulations upon his  
birthday.

Here again the big "I" and the big  
"My" are used; then comes the coun-  
try, with a final appeal to the Deity:

Me and My Army.

"Your majesty's presence here to-  
day is a new and sublime proof to  
me that your majesty, as well as your  
army and your people, feel yourselves  
at one with me and my army and my  
people in their unshakable purpose  
to bring the present war, with the  
help of the Almighty, to a happy and  
joyful conclusion for our peoples."

March 18, accepting the resignation  
of Admiral Von Tirpitz, originator of  
submarine frightfulness, the Emperor  
paid tribute to Tirpitz's work, wind-  
ing up: "This is gladly acknowledged  
by me and by the German nation."

March 31, when the Reichstag  
adopted the Government's tax pro-  
gramme, he sent his congratulations  
to Chancellor Bethmann-Hollweg,  
and wound up with these words: "God is  
with us."

April 24, after the French offensive  
in Artois, the Kaiser congratulated  
Crown Prince Rupprecht of Bavaria,  
German commander: "I send my  
thanks and those of the Fatherland.  
God will help further."

May 6 the Kaiser forgot himself and  
actually put the Fatherland first in a  
birthday message to the Crown  
Prince: "In grateful and full confi-  
dence the Fatherland and I look upon  
you and the other battle fronts which  
imperatively resist all attacks."

June 2 the Kaiser, delighted by the  
cessation of the French Champagne  
offensive, wired the Crown Prince: "I  
charge you to express the thanks of  
myself and the Fatherland to all the  
leaders and troops."

On the same day he wired to the  
Bavarian Crown Prince: "With me  
the German Fatherland thanks its  
sons for their loyal devotion."

When Riga fell the other day the  
Kaiser wired to Prince Leopold of  
Bavaria, in charge:

"I express to you and to the Eight  
army and the Fatherland's con-  
gratulations. Onward with God."

## Dates of the World's Series

The First Game Will be at Chicago  
on October 6th.

Cincinnati, Ohio, September 20.  
When the silver half dollar tossed by  
Frank Navin, of the Detroit Club, re-  
talls up, after President Harry Hem-  
stead of the New York National  
base ball Commission here to-day officially  
announced that Charles Comiskey,  
owner of the Chicago
