ONTARIO HYDRO-ELECTRIC
IS VERY SUCCESSFUL

London, April 1.—Hon. Adam Beck
with his legislative duties.
"What is the effect of the reduction
of the hydro-electric rates in the vari-
ous municipalities?" he was asked.
"We are having a surplus of \$12,000
month," he replied, "notwithstanding
reduction, and by the end of Octo-
ber, 1913, we will have over \$200,000
in the commission treasury to the
credit of the municipalities."

The minister of power said the sum
will be applied to the depreciation
of the hydro-electric system. There is
a balance of \$15,000.
Hon. Mr. Beck intimated that an-
other decrease in the cost of power
might be looked for within a short time.
