# WOULD BE JUSTIFIED

Vancouver Presents Request to Government for Spanning of Seymour Narrows.

Ottawa, Ont., June 11. - A request for a bridge across a piece of the Pacific Ocean was presented to Premier Borden and other members of his Government today. F. H. Sheppard, M. P., of Nanaimo; Ald. Cuthbert Beaumont, Boggs, and C. H. Lugmir formed the deputation. They asked the Government to build a bridge across the Seymour Narrows, and thus connect Vancouver Island and the city of Victoria with the mainland by rail They pointed out that although the plans for a bridge had not been prepared for the place, it was known that the waters could be spanned a structure. Though the cost would b considerable, in the vicinity of \$20, 000,000, the benefits which ould ac crue to Canada would justify the ex penditure. If the construction of the Quebec bridge was warranted, Government was amply justified in

undertaking this work, The Government of British Columoia has already provided for a railroad, which would connect the bridge with the three transcontinental lines the Canadian Pacific, the Grand Frunk Pacific, and the Canadian Northern, on the Island of Vancouver, There would be easy connection rail with the Victoria and other island points. Consideration was promised for the request.
