Berlin, Feb. 15 .- The great clothing strike, which will affect some 50,000 peo-ple, is now spreading into towns like Halle, Stettin and Mannheim. In Hamburg, Berlin and other centres, 1,200 circulars have been distributed explaining the needs and demands of the strikers. The chief demand is the supression of sweaters. Over 120 bureaus have been opened in Berlin alone to receive money for the assistance of the strikers, and some of the newspapers are asking for popular subscriptions.
