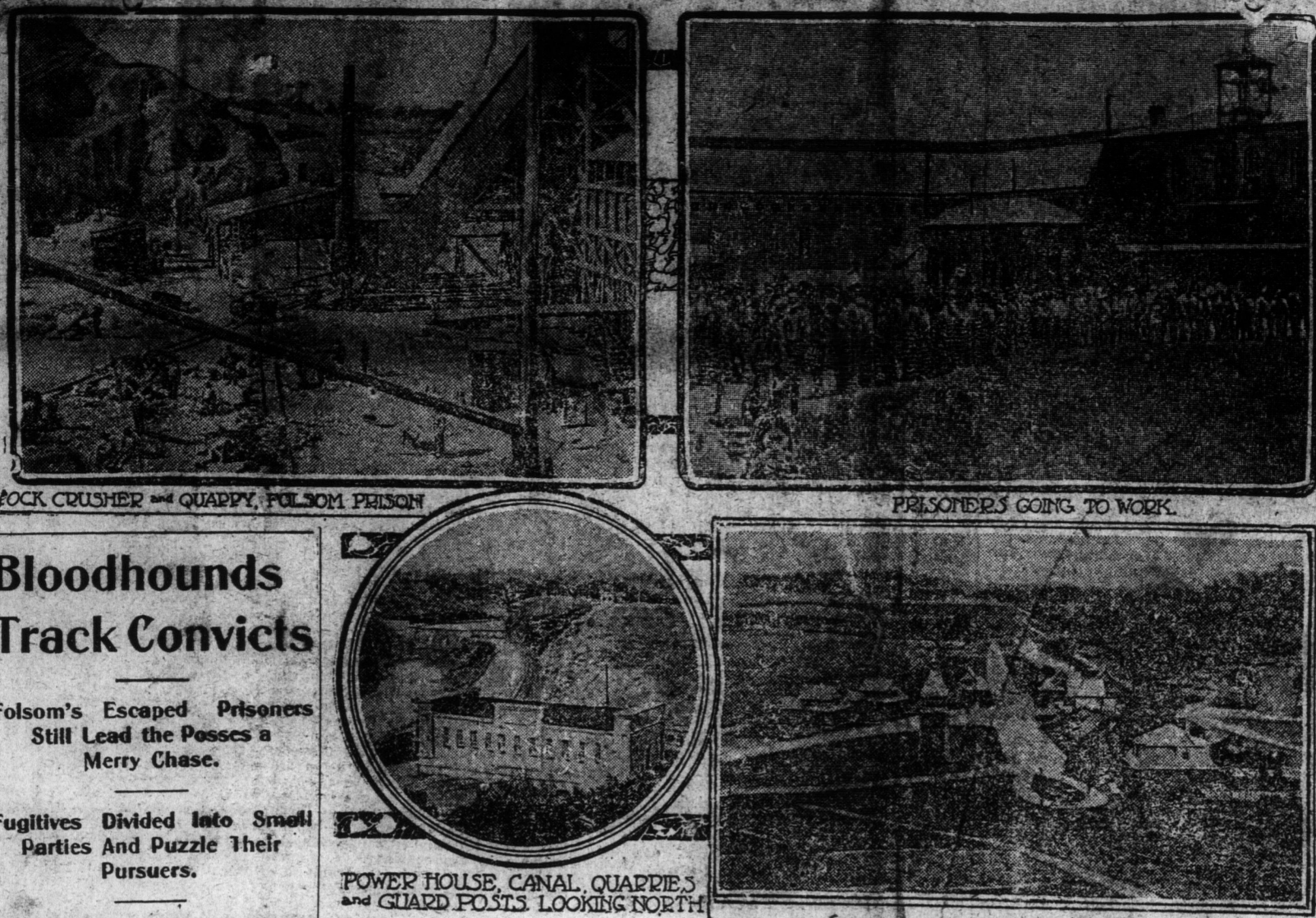
Mr. W. H. Haggis, resident of the lumbermen's association, states that it is incorrect that he is to be a Liberal candidate in the coming election.
