A Statement Has Been Issued But It is Not Promising For the Creditors. A statement of the affairs of John Taylor, the insolvent boot and shoe manufacturer of Bay-street, was issued Saturday. It is not a satisfactory one for the creditors. Liabilities are \$15,625.68, of which \$14,838.79 is unsecured, and the balance, \$791.89, is due for wages and rent. The assets are placed at \$405,816 and comprise stock machinery \$4327.05, real estate \$238.24, hook debts \$1519.94, 1/6 interest in mining lots \$1000, leaving a deficit of \$5967.52.

It is estimated that the creditors will get about 50 cents on the dollar out of the estate. Mr. Taylor it seems was an old miner, and his predeliction to dabble in mines did not forsake him when he went into business. And notwithstanding that he gave his creditors to understand that he was doing well in his mining speculation it did not strengthen him in their eyes.

Minor Failures.

Grant & Co., the well-known hatters and furriers of 77 King-street east, have obtained an extension from their creditors. The firm's indebtedness is principally to Montreal and New York firms. Liabilities are chart \$12,000 about \$12,000.

The stock of James Harris, the insolvent furrier of Yonge-street, is to be sold en bloc, the creditors having refused Mr. Harris' of fer of settlement. Reid, Gilmour & Co. of the steam biscuit and confectionery works, Peterboro, are winding up their business at 100 cents on the
