U.S. CREDIT IN GRAVE DANGER. TREASURY OFFICIALS UNREST OVER THE OUTLOOK. President Cleveland will send a short but vigorous message to Congress today. A Popular Gold Loan Looked Upon as the Best Movement.

Washington, Jan. 27.-Congress must act at once if anything is to be done to afford effective relief to the Treasury and obviate the necessity for the issue of another lot of five per cent. bonds under the provisions of the Resumption Act.
