I say, get the hospital established at once, and aid will be received from sources which do not take enough interest in it while it is only a project. The Ontario Government should make a substantial grant, as the province would be greatly benefited. There should be a place in Toronto where patients could apply and be examined, and if there was a chance of their recovery from the dread disease, send them to a hospital in the mountains. A hospital in the Rocky Mountains would be all right for some cases, but would not suit those of a serious character, owing to the high altitude. I see no necessity for going away out there. If the province builds a

Dr. E. J. Barrick: The subject is one of the greatest importance and is deserving of every support. There is no question as to the necessity of such a hospital. Consumption in an incipient stage is curable, and for such cases I should think the Rocky Mountains, in the vicinity of Kamloops, a very desirable locality. There should be a receiving home in Toronto, where consumptives could be examined. In cases where the disease has reached such a stage as to be considered by the medical men in charge incurable, there should men in charge incurable, there should also be another home where the unfortunates may get lots of air and otherwise enjoy the last days of life. Cases that are considered curable should be sent to the hospital in the Rocky Mountains.

As matters stand now, in the case of a poor man or woman developing consumption, there is nothing to prevent disease having full sway, and the victim is in our midst, leaving us subject to contagion, for there is no doubt whatever that the for there is no doubt whatever that the disease is contagious. Wealthy suffer-ers can go to California and other places to recuperate, and if they are cured they usually stay there, our country thereby losing desirable residents. Johnson: It is time that some step was taken toward building such a hospital, which would prove an such a hospital, which would prove an incalculable blessing to many a poor sufferer from the awful disease. Consumption is contagious, it being communicable through the sputa and there should certainly be some place now in our hospitals set apart for such sufferers and where their expectoration will be thoroughly disinfected. From what I have heard, I think Kamloops in the Rockies would be a good place for a consumption hospital, where we could send consumptives who have not the means to leave the province for a more means to leave the province for a more suitable climate, and have to stay here and die, probably communicating the time. One great advantage exists in the fact that if a small public hospital is put up immediately, there will soon be a large number of private wards be a large number of private wards, and we shall keep in our own country money that would otherwise be spent elsewhere.






