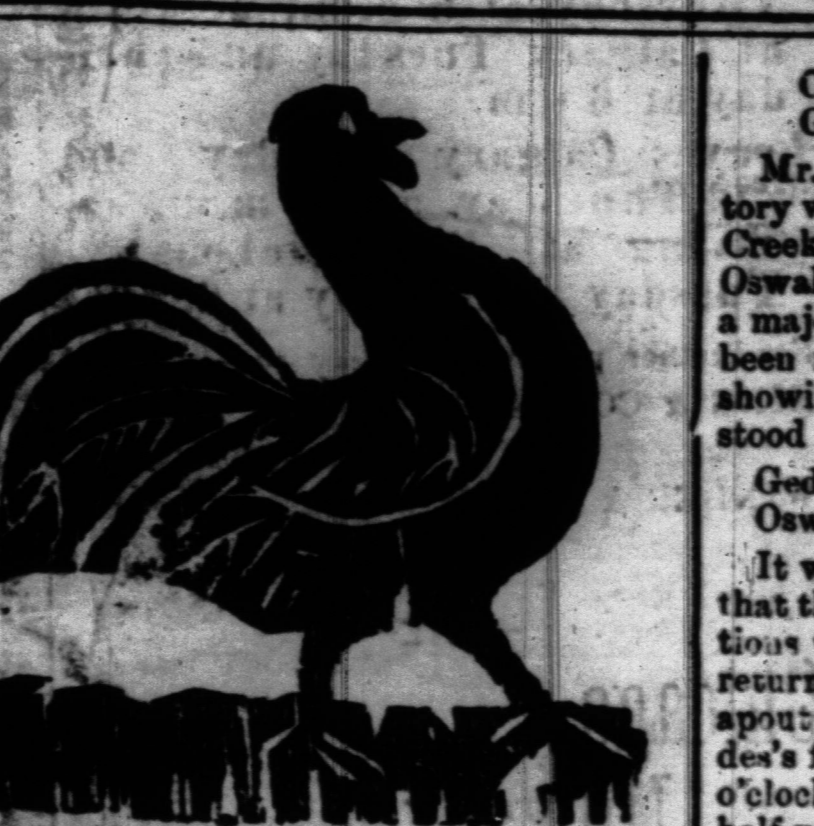

It was evident to Mr. Geddes's friends that the day was theirs, accordingly preparations were made for a celebration.
