we have little of our own merit to interpose so as to avert the chastisement, whether the calamity be in the supernatural or natural order, contagion from without, stagnation of trade within, or, what is of greater import, the faith and morals of our little ones threatened with a compulsory and godless education, we have something to offer God more precious in His sight than ten just souls; we have the merits of the self-sacrificing apostles, who though no longer among us still belong to us, to hold out in propitiation.

PRAYER.

O Jesus, through the most pure Heart of Mary, I offer Thee all the prayers, work and sufferings of this day, for all the intentions of Thy Divine Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, in reparation of all sins, and for all requests presented through the Apostleship of Prayer: in particular for the Missionary nuns who, far from country and home, are toiling for the conversion of unbelievers, that their vocation may be strengthened, their numbers increased and their labors crowned with success.
