The Church of Scotland Mission Record for May, 1889 gives the total contributions (which we suppose includes those above) at £28,485 5s 8d. published Report, pages 138-9, gives the total charge as £26,507 & 1d, aside from the balance Dec. 31, 1888, of £4,854 7s 3d. We suppose that the discrepancies are due to the combination of special funds with the general funds. So with regard to the expenditures, which, on page 141 of the general report, are given as £31,361 15s 4d, inclusive of the balance of £2,250 15s 5d, leaving as actual expenditure then reported, £29,110 19s 11d, made up as follows:
