## ARTICLE II

## Legislation to Which the Agreement Applies

- 1. This Agreement shall apply to the laws and regulations listed hereunder, their present and future complements, consolidations and amendments:
  - (a) with respect to Canada:
    - (i) the Old Age Security Act and the regulations made thereunder; and
    - (ii) the Canada Pension Plan and the regulations made thereunder:
  - (b) with respect to Denmark:
    - (i) the Social Pensions Act and the regulations made thereunder; and
    - (ii) the Labour Market Supplementary Pension (ATP) Act and the regulations made thereunder.
- 2. This Agreement shall apply to laws or regulations which extend the existing legislation to other categories of beneficiaries only if no objection on the part of either Party has been communicated to the other Party within three months of notification of such laws or regulations.

## ARTICLE III

Persons to Whom the Agreement Applies and Equality of Treatment

- 1. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, it shall apply to:
- (a) citizens of either Party;
- (b) refugees, within the meaning of Article 1 of the Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees of July 28, 1951 and of the Protocol of January 31, 1967 to that Convention;
- (c) stateless persons, within the meaning of Article 1 of the Convention Relating to the Status of Stateless Persons of September 28, 1954;
- (d) citizens of third states.
- 2. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, a person described in sub-paragraph 1.(a), (b), or (c) of this Article who resides in the territory of either Party shall be subject to the obligations of the legislation of a Party and shall be eligible for the benefits of that legislation under the same conditions as the citizens of that Party.
- 3. As regards the legislation of Canada, paragraph 2 of this Article shall also apply to the persons described in sub-paragraph 1.(d) of this Article.
