# Appendix

#### World Bank Classification of Developing Economies

The classification of economies used throughout the paper are from the World Bank (1993c), Vol. 1, and are as follows:

### A. Classification by Income Per Capita:

Low-income economies are those with a GNP per capita of US \$675 or less in 1992.

<u>Middle-income economies</u> are those with a GNP per capita of more than US \$675 but less that US \$8,359 in 1991.

### **B.** Classification by Region:

## C. Classification by Analytical Group:

<u>Severely indebted middle-income countries</u> (SIMICs) are the group of 19 middleincome countries that are deemed to have encountered severe debt-servicing difficulties and are defined as those which, averaged over the 1989-91 period, had either of two key ratios above critical levels. First, present value of debt to GNP is above 80%. Second, present value of debt exceeds 200% of the value of exports of goods and services. See Table A1.

<u>Severely indebted lower-income countries</u> (SILICs) are the group of 29 low-income countries and defined as above. See Table A1.
