## [Translation]

**Mr. Guilbault (Saint-Jacques):** Madam Speaker, in each case you have just mentioned you read the main motion, but not the amendment, the conclusion being that the amendment must be voted on before the main motion. First we dispose of the amendment and then of the main motion.

## MOTION FOR CONCURRENCE IN MAIN ESTIMATES, 1987-88

**Hon. Robert de Cotret (President of the Treasury Board)** moved:
