- Winburg, village of: in 1837 is founded by the emigrant farmers under Commandant Potgieter, 109
- Winburg, district of: boundaries in 1840, 322
- \*Wine: after the emancipation of the slaves is exported in much smaller quantities than before, 185
- Witsi, Bantu chief: history of, 511
- Wood, William: in August 1831 arrives in Natal, 127; resides for several months at Umkungunhlovu as interpreter to Dingan, 138; on the 6th of February 1836 witnesses the massacre of Pieter Kotiel and his party, 138; a few days later leaves Zululand, 139
- Woods, Samuel: on the 21st of November 1848 is appointed first collector of customs in the colony of Natal, 365
- \*Wool: after the emancipation of the slaves is produced in rapidly increasing quantities, 185
- van Wyk, Commandant Stephanus: in February and again in March 1835 by the governor's orders calls upon Hintsa to cease assisting the enemies of the Cape Colony, 19; commands one of the four divisions of the army which in March 1835 enters Kaffirland, 19
- Wynberg: in January 1839 is created a magisterial district, 220

YOUNG, Sir Henry Edward Fox: on the 9th of April 1847 arrives in South Africa as lieutenant-governor of the eastern provinces, 234; collects a mass of opinions upon the question of a separate government for that province, 234; makes regulations for locations of coloured people within the boundaries of municipalities, 234; is appointed lieutenant-governor of South Australia, and on the 4th of November 1847 leaves Grahamstown, 235
