A. D. From the cape of Good-Hope, we had an Departure agreeable passage to the Island of St. Helena, from the cape and from thence to England.

We made the lands end in the latter end

Arrival in of July, and being come into the British
the channel, met with brisk gales from the western quarter with thick foggy weather.

On July the thirtieth, in the evening we anchor at anchor'd under Dungeness, and the same night some of the super-cargoes and passengers, and amongst the rest myself, hir'd a small vessel to carry us to Dover, where we arrived at towards London, where we arrived on the first of August.

Thus ended a long and unfortunate voyage of three years, seven months, and some days; after having sail'd very considerably more than round the circumference of the Earth, and having gone through a great variety of dangers, and distresses, both on sea and shore.
