The same was refolved in the Affirmative.

Another Motion was made, and Question put, That the Copy of the said Freedom be presented to John Dunning, Esq. in a Gold Box, of the Value of One Hundred Guineas? The same was resolved in the Assirmative, and ordered accordingly.
