TOOK MONEY FROM LETTER CARRIER LANDED IN JAIL

James Lomas Confessed to Theft When Confronted by P.O. Officials.

A decoy letter landed James Lomas in jail yesterday. He is charged with rifling the royal mail. Just how much stealing he has been guilty of, the department is not certain.

Lomas resides at 39 Sackville street. He is married and has been in the service but one year. He was formerly connected with the Street Railway.

The man's method was new in the experience of the inspector, because he sent the decoy letter in a plain envelope, and placed it in his hand and pocket.

The case illustrates the speed with which the secret service works and the certainty with which those who steal mail matter are detected.

What confused the secret service was the fact that Lomas was not concerned in the delivery of the mail from the office of Manager Briggs.

How Secret Service Men Work.
