His heart has been won by the woman of the slums, and he weds her. Together they launch forward into their new life.

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DR. HILL'S SALARY

HAS NOT BEEN PAID

FOR THREE MONTHS

Mayor Makes Out Checks That Chairman Won't Sign.

COLON BACILLI IN WATER

Samples Are To Be Taken

From All Sources of Supply.

It developed at the meeting of the board of health yesterday afternoon that Dr. H. W. Hill, medical officer of health, had not received any salary from the city for three months past. It seems that Mayor Stevenson persists in having his checks made out at the rate of \$2000 a year, when the agreement calls for \$1000 a year. Chairman C. R. Somerville refuses to sign the checks for the lower sum.

"I will not sign these checks," said Mr. Somerville. "Dr. Hill is entitled to the salary agreed upon, namely, \$1000 a year, and I will sign no checks for any smaller sum. This matter will right itself in time."

There was no discussion of the issue at the meeting of the board of health. It was quite a bit of news to hear that Dr. Hill had not been receiving his salary.

There was a little brush at the beginning of the meeting between Chairman Somerville and Dr. Hill, on the one hand, and Mayor Stevenson, on the other. His worship accused Dr. Hill of allowing the supply of anti-toxin to get down to three 10,000 units. He called attention to this, and a supply was ordered to be made.

Order By Wire.

"There were 13 units, at least," answered Dr. Hill. "Since you refused to sign orders, we order what we require by wire. We always have a supply on hand sufficient for the needs of the city."

"We never have any trouble about that," said Mr. Somerville. "When we want serum we get it. If you would come to Dr. Hill, and not go to others, you would learn the facts of the case."

Dr. W. Wilson, in charge of the veterinary work, reported that he had examined 100 dairies and herds and eight slaughter-houses. All were in good condition. He had found a drop of hog cholera in Westminster Township, but it was not in the city.

The question of milk coming to the city from various sources was brought up, and the herds and dairies will be examined by the city if the milk is sold here. Dr. Wilson reported that about one-third of the milk used in the city was pasteurized.

Bacilli in Water.

Owing to the heavy rains of late some of the city's water has shown a trace of bacilli. It was decided to take samples of the water at all the sources, both at Spring Lake, Horton street and the River.

The smallpox outbreak will cost the city about \$500. This will be charged against the municipalities from which the patients have come. The outbreak is not spreading, but in the smallpox hospital last fall, and a considerable bill for plumbing, amounting to about \$500, had to be paid. This will be prevented in the future.

An ambulance will be secured for Health Inspector James Lutton. Dr. Harris will assist Dr. Hill for the time being.

Considerable routine business was disposed of.
