FIFTY VILLAGES ARE
DRIVEN BACK TO THE FRENCH;
GERMANS ARE COMPELLED

British Troops Drive Ahead Southeast of
Peronne and Reach Points 10 Miles East
of the Somme River.

THE BRITISH REPORT.
LONDON, March 21.—The capture of
40 villages on the front in France is
announced in the official statement
from British headquarters tonight.

"South and southeast of Peronne we
have advanced rapidly during the last
24 hours and occupied points some ten
miles to the east of the Somme. We
have occupied another 40 villages in
this area."

"Between Nurlu and Arras the enemy
is beginning to develop considerable
resistance at a number of places.
Nevertheless, Belgian territory is being
steadily driven from their positions and
our progress continues."

"We carried out successful raids during
the night east of Arras and north-
east of Ypres, damaging his own
trenches. There has been considerable
action during the day by both sides
in the neighborhood of Arras and
Ypres."

"The possibility of a German with-
drawal in the region north of Arras,
and the capture of the Somme, is
forecast in a Central News dispatch
from Amsterdam."

The dispatch quotes a correspondent
in the Northern France as reporting that
the Germans are developing great ac-
tivity in the region of La Bassée
Canal to a point past the Franco-Bel-
gian frontier which he says, "seems
to indicate withdrawal of a salient
line."

THE FRENCH REPORT.
PARIS, March 21.—The official com-
munications issued by the war office to-
night read:

"Northeast of Ham the situation is
without change. Our light forces have
been in contact with the enemy be-
tween Roupy and St. Quentin."

"East of Ham we forced the enemy
at two places. The Government
of the Somme, despite lively re-
sistance by the Germans. The opera-
tion was conducted vigorously and
to clear the north and east margins of
the Somme."

ROWDIES CAUSE TROUBLE
