DR. F. W. STRANGE DEAD.

Dr. Strauge was one of the most prominent military officers in Canada. He was an ex-Captain of the 12th Battalion in York, and of the Queen's Own Rifles, and was surgeon to "C" Company. School of Infantry. In the latter capacity he served in the Northwest Expeditionary Force, and during the second Riel rebellion was in the field.

Dr. Strange's military career in Canada may be briefly summed up as follows: Captain 12th York Rangers of Aurora; captain 12th York Rangers of Aurora; captain Q.O.R., surgeon January 13, 1881; surgeon to "C" School on Dec. 23, 1885; surgeon lieutenant-colonel Sept. 7, 1893. He accompanied the Battleford Column as brigade surgeon, and was present at the battle of Cut Knife Creek. His services were rewarded by a medal and clasp.
